New Dues Structure Issued to BOT in December

- ▶ Minimal Cost Savings
- ▶ No Benefits to BOT or MN Providers
- ▶ Communication Continues
- ▶ No State Partnership Agreement Pending

CAEP COMMUNICATIONS



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Recommendations

- ▶ Preserve rule-making authority of the designated state agency to define minimum qualifications & prerequisites in Administrative Rule
- ▶ Establish an ongoing Career & Technical Education Work Group
- ▶ Consider alternative requirements to a baccalaureate degree for Career & Technical Education licenses
- ▶ Allow two-year accredited institutions of higher education to have the ability to offer content-related teacher preparation programs for Career & Technical Education licenses
- ▶ Create incentives for institutions eligible for alternative preparation providers

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Stakeholder Input Gathered to Make Changes to July Draft

Next Steps

- ▶ BOT Rules redrafted to spell out tiered licensure structure and moving to governor for approval to schedule hearing
- ▶ Legislature will put structure and minimum criteria in statute
- ▶ BOT rule draft & SONAR will be revised to align with statute at the close of session

- ▶ 6 month review of Minnesota NES EAS data
- ▶ Job Analysis Survey and Alignment Activity
- ▶ Standards Alignment and Redevelopment to take place in 5 areas of greatest need
- ▶ Retiring Current fee based study guides in June in order to create free full length exam with answers for study purposes. In early 2018, written rationale for each question will also be available.
